Fancy Letters

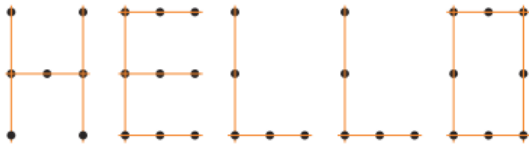
Write each of your words using fancy writing. Your letters could be curly or dotty... or whatever you decide!
