Developing

- 1b. landed, rolled

- 3b. Jason is incorrect because 'push' has been written in the present tense. It should be 'pushed'.

Expected

- 4b. fell, running
- 5b. Various answers, for example: Simon kept the games console when his brother was going away.
- 6b. Liam is incorrect because the verb 'were' is needed before 'coming'. The irregular verb 'begin' should be 'began' in the past tense.

Greater Depth

- 7b. Various answers, for example: stood, making
- 8b. Various answers, for example: The golden sun was shining on the boat as it sped across the clear, blue water.
- 9b. Marc is incorrect because the irregular verb 'feel' is 'felt' in the past tense and the verb 'were' is needed before the verb 'giving'.
